FALL & WINTER REMINDERS

Dogs: City code requires dogs to be on a leash when off the premises of the owner, and to pick up after them. This means they should not be off leash when walking around the pond.

Brush Pick Up: There will be two fall pickups on Mondays, October 28 and November 11, starting at 7:00 a.m. For more information, click here.

Snow & Ice Removal: Homeowners are required by city ordinance to clean sidewalks along property lines - removing snow and ice within 24 hours after snow or ice has ceased to fall or accumulate. If ice cannot be removed, ensure safety by applying salt.

Winter Parking: Winter parking regulations begin December 1. In the City of Franklin, winter parking rules prohibit street parking between 2:00 am and 7:00 am Monday through Saturday, and between 3:00 am and 7:00 am on Sunday.

RECIPE BOX: CIDER PUNCH

Serves 8

Ingredients

6 cups apple cider 1 cup orange juice

1/2 cup lemon juice

1 cup rum - (or whiskey) *optional*

1 liter ginger ale - (about 4 cups)

Apple Cider Punch Garnishes

2 apples - sliced

1 orange - sliced

Cinnamon sticks

Directions

- 1. Place apple cider, orange juice and lemon juice in a large pitcher or punch bowl. Stir to combine.
- 2. If making spiked apple cider punch, add your rum (or whiskey). Toss in sliced apples, oranges and cinnamon sticks.
- 3. Refrigerate to chill at least one hour. When ready to serve, add ginger ale and pour over glasses filled with ice.
