ANNUAL LAKE POINTE POND CLEAN-UP & TREE PLANTING

Maintaining the grounds around the pond for the enjoyment of all is a big job. To hold down costs, and ultimately everyone's dues, we rely on volunteers vs. hiring landscapers to do the work. In addition to the satisfaction of making our neighborhood beautiful, we do offer service hour credit in the amount of \$10 off of next year's dues for every hour of work done. This year, there are a number of jobs that need to be done. Some of these tasks will be done at the annual pond clean up day and others can be done on your own schedule.

Saturday, April 30th, 9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m.

Begin landscaping clean-up and cutting invasive willow trees around the pond.

Sunday, May 15th, 9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m.

Milkweed and tree planting, additional pond clean-up and tree cutting. Meet at the walkway by the north end of the pond to register. Please bring your own garden tools such as rakes, wheelbarrows, shovels and gloves.

SPRING PROJECTS

In order to avoid hiring out for this work and to keep dues down, volunteers are needed for the following projects around the pond:

- Plant grass in the areas where we cut down several trees around the pond.
- Cut down some of the sapling trees along the shoreline and haul to the dump.
- Trim shrubs around the pond and in the outlot on Puetz twice a year.
- Place fieldstone around the culverts to stop erosion.
- Pull weeds in the planting area in the outlot on Puetz road on a regular basis.
- Spread mulch under the trees around the pond.

RECIPE BOX: STRAWBERRY LIMADE

Ingredients

4 limes (1/2 cup lime juice) 1/3 cup sugar 1/3 cup water 1/2 lb sliced strawberries 20 mint leaves 2 cups cold water

Directions

To make the syrup, combine the sugar and water in a saucepan, and cook over medium high heat for 5-8 minutes until the sugar is dissolved and the liquid is clear. Then, In a large pitcher, combine the lime juice, syrup, strawberries, mint, and cold water. Let sit in the refrigerator for 2 hours. Serve and enjoy! Marinade the strawberries in sugar for 30 minutes before adding the pitcher for more flavor and a sweeter taste.
